Greezings!

We are fast approaching our Western Seas Arts and Sciences Baronial Tournament! I anticipate some amazing entries will be created by our talented members in both the fields of Arts and Sciences! Good luck to all who are entering. I am looking forward to another glorious year in Western Seas with our new Arts & Sciences Baron and Baroness.

I also wish to thank Baron Claudius and Baroness Duibheasa for their leadership and care of our Barony these past two years. They have done a wonderful job, have been a joy to work with, and an example to inspire others.

Last year a new Kingdom Law went into effect for all Baronies, which affects our Barony of Western Seas. The section of law that pertains to us, even though we are a Palatine Barony, is as follows:

Article V: Political Subdivisions of Caid, Part B: Administration of Political Subdivisions, Section 1. ...

a. The Crown shall invest a member of the Baronage only after brief SCA resumes from all candidate couples have been provided to the Crown, Kingdom Seneschal, and current Baronage.

As this law is now in effect, all future Western Seas Baronial Tournaments, whether Fighting or Arts and Sciences, will require candidates and their consorts to send this "Letter of Intent/resume" to Crown, the Kingdom Seneschal, and the Baronage, and I am also requesting it be sent to the Baronial Seneschal, who needs the information, as well. It is requested that this be sent prior to the Baronial Tournament taking place.

To simplify this process, it was suggested at our Baronial Officer meeting to reduce the information required to the bare minimum, and create a form which asks all the questions needed for legal purposes, with space for a brief introduction. I have worked with the Kingdom Seneschal, Master Christian de Guerre, and previous Kingdom Seneschal, Master Thomas Blackkeep, to verify exactly what information Kingdom requires. I want to stress that this information is required for any SCA office—it is not a lot of information, and the form should take only minutes to fill out. The "Paragraph of Introduction" section can be as simple as a couple

sentences or as detailed as the candidate and consort wish. As we are a great distance from Kingdom, and many of us have not met the Crown or Kingdom Seneschal, the "Paragraph of Introduction" section is a way to let Kingdom know who the candidate and consort are, in their own words. The candidate may fill out the paragraph of introduction for their consort, if they wish.

It was suggested that an online interactive form might help some people to do the Letter of Intent. We have worked out the form with the Kingdom Seneschal office, input from the Baronial Officers and Baron and Baroness, and the technical expertise of our talented webwright, Bantiarna Sadhbh. It will forward to the Kingdom Seneschal, Crown, the Western Seas Baron and Baroness and Western Seas Seneschal.

If a candidate does not wish to use the online form, that is fine. The Letter of Intent can be submitted by e-mail or regular mail. However, keep in mind that the information in the letter must include both the candidate and the consort, and be sent to the following...

The Crown: crown@sca-caid.org

The Kingdom Seneschal: seneschal@sca-caid.org

The Baron & Baroness: barony@westernseas.org

The Baronial Seneschal: seneschal@westernseas.org

If anyone should wish to send the letter via USPS, they will need to get the mailing address of all these persons. You can answer the same questions as in the online form, as all that information is required, as well as the paragraphs of introduction for both the candidate and consort.

I hope this form will simplify the process of writing the Letter of Intent, which is now required for entering any Baronial tournament.

As a service to the Barony, a new LoI submission form has been created for use upon the Baronial Website. Visit WesternSeas.org, hover you cursor over the "Officers" menu item, and there appears the "Baronial Intent" link which should be clicked to get to the page.

Therein, contenders will find information about becoming a Baron or Baroness, what responsibilities will be bestowed, and the LoI form. Complete the form in its entirety - otherwise you will not be able to submit it. When you are satisfied, simply click the "Send" button (after proving thou art not a robot!) and the form will be automatically sent to Their Royal Majesties, Their Excellencies, and the Seneschals of both the Kingdom and our Barony. A copy will also be forwarded to you, dear hopeful, for your own records.

After sending off your LoI - get to work on your submissions if you hadn't already done so! From wonderous food-stuffs to grand works of thread, all hopefulls are allowed three (3) entries into the tournament. Don't forget to include full documentation on your submissions. This year, Bantiarna Sadhbh inghean Uí Conghal (our Chronicler and Webwright) will be Tabulator as she has no interest or intent for being Baroness. For complete instructions on what is expected with your entries, once again refer to the Baronial Website, and you will see the A&S Baronial Tournament (and Royal Visitation) announcement in the blue rotation box. Click that with yon cursor to be directed to the actual page with all the information you will need.

Did I mention "Royal Visitation"? Ah, yes!

As an added bonus to this year's Baronial Competition, Their Royal Highnesses, Crown Prince Alexander and Princess Tahira will be in attendance during their visit to our humble Barony! His Highness will bring his armor and would like to test the mettle of any heavy-fighter willing to face him.

Cooking with Claudius

H i boys and girls!

On todays recipe we will go into the book of Cuoco Napoletano. (The Neapolitan Recipe Collection) We will be doing recipe 50: Florentine-Style Meat in a Baking Dish.

The one thing that you must know when you are doing a period dish is that you cook that dish as you cook your own dish, you have heat, spices, liquid, ingredients and a pot or pan to cook it in. It will not mater if you use a stove, oven, or a fire pit, you still control the heat and the spices and how long you cook it, on a oven or stove you play with the knobs for the heat for high or low, in a pit you put your pot how near or how far to control the heat, so you see, if you are a bad cook you are a bad cook and if you are good you are good, but knowing what you are doing helps, the same as before and the same as now.

What I am saying is if you use your knowledge of cooking you can do any period recipe.

Before you start anything you must get all your ingredients together as in pic one (from left to right: ground cloves, cinnamon, saffron, black pepper, sea salt, sugar, pork, oinon, prunes, raisins, red wine, and verjuice, if you do not find verjuice you can make your own with one cup of white unsweetened grape juice and 3 tsp. vinegar as in pic two).

This dish calls for veal or any other meat (veal was used a lot and not because of them being rich but it was a useless animal, on the farms it was a mother mouth to feed and they used the cow for work and milk for making cheese) and to cut it as big as your fist, (if you think about it that's

big so you would cut it the size of stew meat as in pic 3).

Now, put your ingredients in a baking dish or pot with water, wine, verjuice, raisins, prunes, salt, or with onions or not, if not you can add parsley root, (even the cooks back then had to change the recipes for there employers because said employers would not eat there spinach).

So now the liquid should cover the the meat by a finger. (if you stick your index finger in and touch the bottom the liquid should cover your finger as in pic 4).

Now put your dish in the oven at 350 degrees and check it when it's half done, (for a dish with 1 and 1/2 lb. of meat cut into stew pieces check it in 30min. and give it a mix).

Then you add in the other ingredients: cloves, cinnamon, pepper, and saffron, as in pics 5 and 6 (if the recipe tells you to make it taste of pepper it only tells you to make it taste hot, to make a spicy dish they used a lot of pepper, so it would be up to you to do it or not).

After you add the rest of ingredients cook another 30 minutes (after you added the spices the recipe will say, "...when it is half cooked, turn it over; then take it out..." all it is telling you is to cook the other half when you add the spices).

After the dish is finished you plate it and add spices and sugar on it (make sure when you do that you use the same spices that you cooked the dish with as in pic 7 & 8, you should always use the same spice that you used on the dish).

Florentine Style Meat in a Baking Dish

Ingredients

1 1/2 lb. pork sirloin chop

1 cup water

1 cup wine Merlot

1 cup verjuice

(1 cup white grape juice and 3 tsp. vinegar, mixed well)

1/2 onion

1/2 cup prunes

1/2 cup raisins

3 cloves

1/2 tsp. cloves

1tsp. cinnamon

1tsp. pepper

1/4 tsp. saffron

 $1 \frac{1}{2}$ tsp. sea salt

Preparation

Get veal or another meat with bone. cut it into pieces as small as a fist, and put them into a baking dish with a little water, a beer of wine and another of good verjuice; if your master likes, add in a few slices of onion... or, should he not like onions, use parsley, the root, that is -along with raisins, dried prunes, and salt; cover the meat by no more then a finger of water, and set in the oven. When it looks half done, add a few cloves, a good lot of cinnamon, pepper and a good lot of saffron and let it taste of pepper; when it is half cooked, turn it over; then take it out onto a plate with spices and sugar on top.







From the Philosophers Guilo

The other day, while at fighter practice I had to stop to remove one of those tiny rocks that seems to get itself in the darnedest of all places, inside my boot. Anyone who has been trading blows to the head for as long as I have will tell you that fighting (or stone removal) is not a high order thinking exercise - certainly not requiring any abstract thought. But this darn stone, which interfered with my fighting, got me to thinking about counting, and numbers in general.

Many people associate the Greek (followed by the Roman) age as being a high point in thinking. Whereas that may be true for many fields, this is not the case with mathematics (which is not to be confused with Geometry - would you believe these were separate for most of the Middle Ages?). Despite what many believe, mathematics made great, if very isolated, strides during the later medieval period. The main reason had to do with the choice of numbers used, and more importantly, a change that removed the mystery of multiplication. Up until the 13th century, the act of multiplying was considered the great mystery of mathematics, and we are not even going to discuss what was thought of division!

To understand the exalted mystery of multiplication, let us consider a very simple example; 12 X 4. We all know what the answer is, but try doing this using the number system that was common at the early medieval age - the so-called Roman numeral system.

To those of you who have not seen this system since your early education years, let me remind you: I indicated one, II meant two, III menat three, and IIII meant four (so far, very primitive). Five was indicated by V (think of a hand with all fingers splayed out, and the shape formed by the thumb and small finger). Ten was X (two hands, one above the other), fifty was L (harder to explain, but was thought to indicate an extra slash on a tally stick. As such, was initially written as an upside-down T. By the time of Augustus, it was L). One hundres was C (century), and M for 1,000 (millinia). So, for example, MMXVII is the mundane year. In fact, it is thought that Roman carvers were beginning to get tired of the long number notation, and this lead to the shortening of some of their numbers. As such, IIII becomes IV, VIIII becomes IX, etc.



So, back to our problem; how do you multiply two numbers in the Roman way? The answer is successive additions - don't think of it as 4 X 12, instead consider...

$$XII + XII + XII + XII$$

... which can be broken apart, and regrouped as...

XXXXVIII

... which later became XLVIII, or 48.

Well, as you can see, this will work for small numbers being multiplied, but what about those big number products? Like, how many bodies does Lord Claudius have buried in his back yard? Or how many Sestersi will it take to bribe the entire Senate to forget about those bodies in Lord Claudius' back yard? Or, if Saint Marco could perform 49 miracles in 49 days, how many beer will Valeran consume while sitting in Lord Claudius' back yard? Big problems, and it is no wonder that the Romans viewed multiplication as a great mystery!

In the very early 12th century, a book with the title *Liber Abaci* by Leonardo Fibonacci (most likely from Pisa), introduced Europe to what the Arabians already knew, multiplication is way mucho easier using Arabic numerals, the basis of our modern numeral system. In fact, I would bet that many of you readers learned this at the early age when you were first introduced to the Roman numbers - when given a multiplication problem, didn't you convert to Arabic, perform the multiplication, and then try to figure out how to write the anser in Roman? After the mysery of multiplication was removed, mathematics became a much more accessible, as well as applicable tool, and there was no looking back.

Anyway, to aid in these very difficult product determinations, the Romans fell back on a very simple tool, using tiny stones (in little bowls) to keep count of how many Is, Vs, Xs, Ls, Cs, and Ms you had. The stones were called *calculi*, and the process of multiplication was known (then) as *calculus* - the root of our very modern word *calculation*.

Which just goes to show,

you should never drink and derive!

SCA Model Release Form

Required to be signed by subject when...

- *the image is portrait-style.
- *the photo is taken in a private space at an event (such as a personal encampment).
- *the photograph is taken at a non-public venue (such as an armor-making workshop at a home or closed event).

SCA Photograph Grant of Use Form Required to be signed by the photographer for any and all photos in use after December 31, 2010.

A photographer may check the "Perpetual Grants of Use" box, meaning the form is required only one time and it covers any photograph submitted for use by the Barony now or in the future.

SCA Creative Work Copyright
Assignment/Grant of Use Form
Required to be signed by the author or artist
for the following...

- *articles, poems, stories, songs written content submitted for publication.
- *original artwork (not clip art) submitted digitally for publication.

No form is needed for...

- *correspondence from officers or even organizers
- *event notices
- *captions to photographs

Caid Personal Information Release Required to be signed when...

- *event organizers wish to use their personal email/phone number for contact
- * officers wish to have their modern names used in the Regnum
- *article writers wish to use their modern name in the by-line


Waivers are to be submitted along with pertinent works to the Chronicler and/or the Webwright. Waivers can be submitted digitally (scanned as PDF or JPG). Hard-copies received will be scanned. All waivers are stored digitally in a private filing system managed by Kingdom Caid. Hard-copy Waivers are kept on file with the Constable after being scanned.

Combat & Equestrian Waivers are special waivers needed to participate in events related to each. Please speak to the Marshal for more information.

Blue Card vs. White Card

SCA members who have (digitally) signed a Waiver of Liability when joining possess a Blue Membership Card. Members who have not signed this waiver have a White Membership Card. If a member possesses the White Card, that member must sign combat waivers at each event to participate in combat.
