





ABOUT THE COVER

Anticipation for our new Baron and Baroness is growing as the hopefuls finish their Arts and Sciences projects for the A&S Baronial Tournament in September. Perhaps they will be as humble as King Richard II of England, portrayed here in one of the Wilton Diptych panels (c. 1395 - 1399).

A diptych is any object with two flat plates attached at a hinge. In medieval times, the diptych would contain a recessed space filled with wax for taking notes. When the notes were no longer needed, the was would be heated, then flattened, ready for reuse. This particular



diptych was part of a portable alterpiece.

In this panel, the King is kneeling before the Virgin and Child (depicted on the other panel, not shown). He is presented to them by his patron saints, John the Baptise, Edward the Confessor and Edmund the Martyr.



Society News Brief

We like to think that in as much as we, being members of the SCA, are helping to bring about the better parts of our chosen period, we must not forget that there are aspect to those times-gone-by that are not acceptable today. Recent events prompted some update(s) by the SCA regarding the Harassment and Bullying Policy.

From the Society Seneschals Handbook:

XXIV. SOCIETY SENESCHAL POLICIES & INTERPRETATIONS

4. Harassment and Bullying

The SCA prohibits harassment and bullying of all individuals and groups.

Harassment and bullying includes, but is not limited to the following:

>> offensive or lewd verbal comments directed to an individual;

>> the display of explicit images (drawn or photographic) depicting an individual in an inappropriate manner;

>> photographing or recording individuals inappropriately to abuse or harass the individual;

>> inappropriate physical contact; unwelcome sexual attention; or retaliation for reporting harassment and/or bullying. Participants violating these rules are subject to appropriate sanctions. If an individual feels subjected to harassment, bullying or retaliation, they should contact a seneschal, President of the SCA, or the Kingdom's Board Ombudsman. If a participant of the SCA becomes aware that someone is being harassed or bullied, they have a responsibility pursuant to the SCA Code of Conduct to come forward and report this behavior to a seneschal, President of the SCA or Kingdom's Board Ombudsman.

The following statement must be posted at gate/troll at every SCA event in a size large enough for people to see it as they enter our events. This language must likewise be quoted in ALL site handouts at every event a site where a handout is made available.

THE SCA PROHIBITS HARASSMENT AND BULLYING OF ALL INDIVIDUALS AND GROUPS.

Participants engaging in this behavior are subject to appropriate sanctions.

If you are subjected to harassment, bullying or retaliation, or if you become aware of anyone being harassed or bullied, contact a seneschal, President of the SCA, or your Kingdom's Board Ombudsman.

Arts & Sciences Baronial News

The Arts & Sciences Baronial Competition is being held on September 30, 2017 at the Windward Community College Campus. Those hopefuls wishing to lead the Barony of Western Seas, who do not partake of the Art of War, are hereby invited to submit their Letter of Intent and to prepare their entries into the tourney.

As a service to the Barony, a new LoI submission form has been created for use upon the Baronial Website. Visit WesternSeas.org, hover yon cursor over the "Officers" menu item, and there appears the "Baronial Intent" link which should be clicked to get to the page.

Therein, contenders will find information about becoming a Baron or Baroness, what responsibilities will be bestowed, and the LoI form. Complete the form in its entirety - otherwise you will not be able to submit it. When you are satisfied, simply click the "Send" button (after proving thou art not a robot!) and the form will be automatically sent to Their Royal Majesties, Their Excellencies, and the Seneschals of both the Kingdom and our Barony. A copy will also be forwarded to you, dear hopeful, for your own records.

After sending off your LoI - get to work on your submissions if you hadn't already done so! From wonderous food-stuffs to grand works of thread, all hopefulls are allowed three (3) entries into the tournament. Don't forget to include full documentation on your submissions. This year, Bantiarna Sadhbh inghean Uí Conghal (our Chronicler and Webwright) will be Tabulator as she has no interest or intent for being Baroness. For complete instructions on what is expected with your entries, once again refer to the Baronial Website, and you will see the A&S Baronial Tournament (and Royal Visitation) announcement in the blue rotation box. Click that with yon cursor to be directed to the actual page with all the information you will need.

As an added bonus to this year's Baronial Competition, Their Royal Highnesses, Crown Prince Alexander and Princess Tahira will be in attendance during their visit to our humble Barony! His Highness will bring his armor and would like to test the mettle of any heavy-fighter willing to face him.

To day we will explore a favorite dish of Hawaii, a dish like Mantou, dumplings, dim-sum, Bao, Jiaozi, and won ton. So our main topic today will be Mantou a steamed bun or one that has a filling in it, one that is all know to you in the Islands is "MANAPUA" (Cha sir boa pork bun).

Mantou is a bun that is made from whole wheat flour and it is steamed, we can go back as far back as Western Han Dynasty 206 BC-AD 25 or farther, the principal grain of northern China was wheat and not rice so from the north came buns, pancakes (yes they had pancakes), noodles, stuffed buns, dumplings, wonton, and more wheat stuff. In the south you got your rice and with it came rice noodles, rice cakes, thick rice noodles, rice balls in soup, and other pasta and pastry dishes. Rice came to the rest of China in the Han Dynasty with improvements in irrigation and opening up of the south so rice gradually became a staple food.

Steamed buns and other dim sum dishes in the Chinese court were made by the pastry chef, the dough that they used in making buns, bread, and steamed goods was a sourdough made with leavening, they had varieties of yeast cultures and maintained them primarily for brewing. After the conquest of China by the Mongol, the Mongol gradually adopted food and festivals and the Chinese ways of life.

In the Yuan Dynasty 1269-1368 you had steamed buns dishes made with sheep, goat, steamed eggplant with filling, and date fillings. They used the fat from the tail of the sheep which shows the interaction the Mongols had with Muslims and some of their dishes. From the Mantou to the Wonton (yun-tuncloud swallowing) we have a large quantity of dim-sum (dimsam- dianxin, tidbits) to make and with the broader spectrum it covers other delicacies aside filled pasta. Step one, the Dough

For the dough you will need (pic 1) ...

6 cups whole wheat flour 2 teaspoon ground sea salt 3 teaspoon yeast or 3 yeast packs (we will use yeast and not leavening, but if you must you must) 1 teaspoon sugar 2 cups warm water

In a bowl add yeast, sugar, and one cup warm water and mix it. Put your bowl in a warm place for five min to let yeast rise. After five minutes, take it out and it should look like pic two. Now add yeast mixture to flour and mix to make a stiff dough adding remaining water as needed, after dough is made put it on a floured board and knead it as in pic three for 15 minutes. After dough is kneaded it should look like pic four. Take dough and put it in a warm place to rise for 1 1/2 hours.

Step two, the Filling

For the filling you will need (pic 5)...

- 2 pounds pork
- 1 whole mandarin orange peel with pith removed and dice
 1 green onion chopped
 2 garlic cloves minced
 1 teaspoon fresh grated ginger
 1 1/2 teaspoon seas salt
 1 teaspoon black pepper
 1/2 teaspoon turmeric
 1/4 cup soy sauce
 1/4 cup sesame oil

Take the sharp edge your knife and put it on the pith side of your peel in an angle away from you and scrape away from you as in pic six, then dice your peel to look like pic seven.

In a pan on medium heat, add oil and brown pork, then garlic, peel, ginger, salt, pepper, turmeric, and soy sauce, cook for a few minutes. Then add green onion, cook for one minute, set aside and cool; it should look like pic eight.

Step three, the Mantou (Manapua)

Take dough that you have made, it should have doubled in size, punch it

down and give it a quick knead to take all the air out.

Take 3oz of dough and roll it into a ball, then push your thumb into the middle and push and pull outward in a clockwise movement until you have a 3" disk as in pics nine and ten.

Take 2 tablespoons of filling and put in the middle of dough as in pic eleven.

After you put the filling in pinch the dough close and twist the top shut like in pics twelve and thirteen.

Now take your steamer and line it with parchment paper and put manapua one inch apart as in pic fourteen (or you could do it the old way of putting a cloth in the steamer as lining) and let rise for 45 minutes.

Now after it has risen bring your water to a boil in your steamer and put your buns in and steam for 25 min, after it is done it should look like pic fifteen.

Here in the Islands, a dough that can be used that will taste the same as our local manapua is a basic sweet dough. You will need 6 cups flour, 2 slightly beaten eggs, 2 packs yeast, 1 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/2 cup sugar, 1/4 cup warm water, 1 1/2 cup warm milk, 1/2 cup melted butter. Follow the dough instructions above.

The original recipe calls for mutton, ginger, mandarin peel, salt, sauce and spice. When a recipe says spice or herbs, all that it is saying is that part is left up to the cook to add what he wants into the dish. I use things that they used in their cooking like black pepper, garlic, turmeric, and soy sauce (they had a sauce like soy sauce and made the same way). I used pork to just make it easy on everyone, but you can use any kind of roast meat or sea food and even sweets. Here in the Islands we can get roast pork to make this dish.

SCA Model Release Form

Required to be signed by subject when... *the image is portrait-style.

*the photo is taken in a private space at an event (such as a personal encampment).
*the photograph is taken at a non-public venue (such as an armor-making workshop at a home or closed event).

SCA Photograph Grant of Use Form Required to be signed by the photographer for any and all photos in use after December 31, 2010.

A photographer may check the "Perpetual Grants of Use" box, meaning the form is required only one time and it covers any photograph submitted for use by the Barony now or in the future.


SCA Creative Work Copyright Assignment/Grant of Use Form Required to be signed by the author or artist for the following... *articles, poems, stories, songs - written content submitted for publication. *original artwork (not clip art) submitted digitally for publication. No form is needed for... *correspondence from officers or even organizers *event notices *captions to photographs Caid Personal Information Release Required to be signed when... *event organizers wish to use their personal email/phone number for contact * officers wish to have their modern names used in the Regnum *article writers wish to use their modern name in the by-line

Waivers are to be submitted along with pertinent works to the Chronicler and/or the Webwright. Waivers can be submitted digitally (scanned as PDF or JPG). Hard-copies received will be scanned. All waivers are stored digitally in a private filing system managed by Kingdom Caid. Hard-copy Waivers are kept on file with the Constable after being scanned.

Combat & Equestrian Waivers are special waivers needed to participate in events related to each. Please speak to the Marshal for more information.

Blue Card vs. White Card SCA members who have (digitally) signed a Waiver of Liability when joining possess a Blue Membership Card. Members who have not signed this waiver have a White Membership Card. If a member possesses the White Card, that member must sign combat waivers at each event to participate in combat.
