### ABOUT THE COVER

One of the greatest riches of the Irish is their knowledge, and their ability to express through artistic creations - such as the Book of Kells. An illuminated manuscript gospel book in Latin, this work is believed to have been created around 800 AD and is the product of several scribes believed to be from broth Britain and Ireland.

Gracing the front cover of the Runestone is the carpet page of folio 33. A carpet page is generally made of



geometric designs and is used at the beginning of each section of the manuscript, essentially separating the gospels from one another. This carpet shows various knots with animals.

### Cooking with Claudius

H i boys and girls!

Today we will be making a cake, it's a French cake called A Ladv Lucia Cake and when we say cake what we are actually saying is, it's a enriched bread. I know that most of you came across things in your reading like cake or cakes about food and what people ate back in the day, and you are now thinking, WOW!! they had cake "I CAN DO THIS" ..... it's easy ....take some flour.....take some milk..... take some salt..... take some eggs..... take some sugar... oil... baking powder... vanilla... bake it and take it to an event Bwhahahaha.....I can do this!!!

Well buckaroo, hold your horses, baking powder was invented in the nineteenth century with a combo of baking soda and cream of tartar and a starch to act as an anti caking agent, so it will not be that easy, you will have to take out baking powder and it will not be ready in a half hour. In Antiquity you had unleavened bread flour and water, Medieval bread had a leavening made with a starer of flour and water left over night in a warm pace (sourdough), and then there was enriched breads (cake or cakes), made with cream or milk, sugar, eggs, butter, salt, spices, cream cheese, and dried fruits. Our cake will have brewer's yeast, by the way when they say cake or cakes, the difference is one that is big and the other is

small and many, small or big it is stillanenrichedbread.

Brewer's yeast is the foam that is spontaneously formed on the surface of fermenting beer, it is collected, washed, and then dried, the Egyptians made bread with it, the Romans adopted it, but sorry to say it had little use in medieval bread only to have a reemergence in 1665 France through the influence of Italian bakers, but it still was mad into a leavening by adding liquid and flour and letting it sit before using it. Enriched breads were not only made for the rich and famous, it was used for weddings, funerals, holidays, gods, and for one self. So next time you dress up as Marie Antoinette at a war and you strike a pose and say "LET THEM EAT CAKE" it is not the cake of today but probably a Brioche.

#### The Cake

Get all of your ingredients together as in pics 1 & 2. You will need...

3 cups flour, plus 1 cup

1 cup whole heat flour

1 pint half & half (cream)

1-1/2 tablespoon ground sea salt

1 pound butter

12 eggs

4 tablespoons brewer's yeast

#### Instructions

1. In bowl, put 8 egg yolks and 4 whole eggs, slightly beat, as in pics

4 or 13

3 & 4.

- 2. In a pot, add butter and cream and heat to boiling as in pic 5.
- 3. In a bowl add flour, salt, and whole wheat flour. Then add hot cream and butter, and mix. It should look like cake batter. Let cool as in pic 6.
- 4. Now to make the leavening, in a bowl mix flour, yeast, and warm cream. It should look like thick batter. Put in a warm place for half an hour until it has bubbles.
- 5. Add leavening to batter and mix. If too soft, add more flour. It should be thick and sticky. Put parchment paper on your baking plates, then put your batter in plate about an inch high as in pic 8 and gild it.

NOTE: Do not put gold leaf on it! In baking you put a false brilliance or make your food shine by using oil or an egg wash. The book didn't say what to use, but most of them used oil or butter.

Put cake in a warm place for 1-1/2 hour ro rise.

6. when the cake is ready to bake, make a slash on the top with a knife, then put it in th oven at 325 for an hour and a ahlf. Then you can take it out and eat!

# From the Philosophers Guilo

A fter a brutal practice, where I have had my teeth rattled a couple times, I find that a visit to an establishment that serves large quantities of a mild anesthetic to be just what the doctor ordered. Often this leads me, in all innocence, to the study of esthetics – basically, I love to combine my favorite hobbies of drinking beer and looking for beauty.



The other day, while quaffing my favorite brew, I happened to notice that the serving girl had decorated her eyelids with a dark mineral presumably to draw attention to her eyes. As much as we would like to think of this being a modern trend, nothing could be further from the truth. In fact, this custom

has been around since the times of the Egyptians and the Assyrians.

The Egyptians called this cosmetic mineral stibu (later stibnite), and it was widely used throughout the Middle Ages, not only as a cosmetic, but also for health. In fact, John of Rupescissa (1310-1362), a French alchemist considered this substance to be central to the study of alchemical medicine. It seems that stibnite could be used as a laxative (makes you go) and a purgative (makes you barf). When you consider the poor diet and hygiene of the day, one finds this to be particularly useful! As a purgative, it is a good way to expel disease from the body. As a laxative, swallowing pills of pure stibnite cured the constipation caused by the poor diet of the times. The pills were not absorbed by the body, but were excreted –



and recovered for reuse.

Many nobles would
purchase these pills to
provide personal protection
against disease. In fact, one
of these stibnite pills would
be good to have on hand
the next time you are
attending a feast that His
Lordship Claudio has
prepared - and you believe

he might just be mad at you.

Anyway, so wide spread was its medicinal use that it wasn't until early 1600's that it was found that stibnite may in fact be toxic. The story we have today is that an early chemist and enthusiastic experimenter, Basil Valentine (1565-1614), claimed that when he administered it (via a powder) in a monastery, some of the monks died.

This inspired Basil to rename the substance antimonachos (anti-monk) in his seminal work "The Triumphal Chariot of Antimony" (1604). It is now known as Antimony and throughout the later Renaissance it was a favorite slow poison.

The Assyrians, however, called the dark mineral guhlu, which later was called kohl in Arabic. I am told that this term is still used for eyeliner. The phrase al-kohl was used to describe any fine powder - especially those obtained by separating it from the solution into which it was dissolved. To obtain kohl, you crushed a specific type of dirt into water mixture. After filtering, the dark liquid was laid out to dry in the sun. What was left was a fine powder that was then ground down into a very fine powder. The process by which you separate various mixed liquids by their boiling points is called distillation. Early in the Middle Ages primitive distillation practices were used to obtain many fine powders. As the distillation techniques improved, purified liquids, and essences were made. At some point the term al-kohl was converted to alcohol.

And I'm back to my brew.

#### SCA Model Release Form

Required to be signed by subject when...

- \*the image is portrait-style.
- \*the photo is taken in a private space at an event (such as a personal encampment).
- \*the photograph is taken at a non-public venue (such as an armor-making workshop at a home or closed event).

SCA Photograph Grant of Use Form Required to be signed by the photographer for any and all photos in use after December 31, 2010.

A photographer may check the "Perpetual Grants of Use" box, meaning the form is required only one time and it covers any photograph submitted for use by the Barony now or in the future.

SCA Creative Work Copyright
Assignment/Grant of Use Form
Required to be signed by the author or artist
for the following...

- \*articles, poems, stories, songs written content submitted for publication.
- \*original artwork (not clip art) submitted digitally for publication.

No form is needed for...

- \*correspondence from officers or even organizers
- \*event notices
- \*captions to photographs

Caid Personal Information Release Required to be signed when...

- \*event organizers wish to use their personal email/phone number for contact
- \* officers wish to have their modern names used in the Regnum
- \*article writers wish to use their modern name in the by-line


